Artist Demo by James Tobin

- Diane introduced James by explaining that around 6-8 years ago she began noticing digital artists winning awards that this new digital art form was coming to the forefront.
- James is an artist and musician from Beaver County who came from a family of artists
- He discovered Adobe products through his work around 20 years ago
- What is digital art?
 - Anything that is created or manipulated digitally
 - Art can be spurred from simple doodles from his phone (using Adobe Sketch, which has features like a paintbrush, marker, and layering applications)
- James creates digital drawings as well as edits and enhances photos

- You can remove parts of images you don't want (example: the mat under the Jeep) and add or improvise parts of images that may have gotten cropped out (example: the rest of the Jeep tire at the bottom of the photo)
- He can piece together and layer drawings for backgrounds with images
- Programs James uses:
 - Adobe Photo Fix is what he used to remove the dog leash from the winter picture.
 - o Photoshop Mix is what he used to put his face in the portrait of the Merrick family.
 - The whole Adobe Creative Suite gives you access to applications on the computer and your phone, as well as gives you an online platform for sharing, which comes with membership.
- It is very important that when you are working digitally you save works to 300 dpi (this is for a high quality print)
- His creations have been printed on metal, glass, canvas, and acrylic plastic
 - There is no particular shop he likes best but encourages to order a small print first when ordering from a new company to check out their quality first
 - He reports that Walmart photo printed canvases are flimsy

 - James reports that most of his sales come from shows rather than online but still
 encourages everyone to invest in a website he likes and uses wordpress but
 encourages members to pay extra to remove the site ads
 - It is smart to post smaller or lower resolution images on your website to try and deter people from stealing your images
