She helps content creators such as artists, authors, and coaches protect their most valuable assets –copyrighted works. Works can include paintings, photographs, illustrations, books, movies, music, and so much more. Kathleen assists creators in getting their works registered with the US Copyright Office for full protection. She advises clients on issues such as fair use and infringement – especially on social media. She also drafts licensing agreements and will pursue infringers of her clients' protected works.

Kathleen earned her Juris Doctor from the Duquesne University School of Law. She has a Bachelor of Science in Biology from Penn State University and a Ph.D. from the University of Missouri-Columbia. Kathleen is also a member of Toastmasters International and is active in two local clubs that meet in Cranberry Twp.

JANUARY 2023 ART CHALLENGE: NOIR

In the mid 19th century, French artists began depicting shadowy, often nocturnal or twilight scenes in which forms appear to emerge out of darkness. This quest for darkened realms led them to explore new subject matter, such as dream states and non-idealized representations of contemporary life.

The range and availability of black drawing materials exploded with the Industrial Revolution, along with

improvements in working methods. This coincided with an interest in painterly techniques, not only in drawing but also in printmaking. It is impossible to say what influences came first, but what followed was a graphic exploration of darkness that constitutes an important moment in the history of Modernism.

This is a show about the strange, uncanny beauty in the bright colors of gas station signs, the eerie light of a 24-hour grocery stores in the liminal hours of the night, or the long, empty stretches of road where the dark feels sinister. We'll be drawing from the sensibilities of pop art that even a label or a road sign can be artistic and beautiful, but still allowing for the lush, anachronistic quality of impressionism and older artistic traditions. This is a show for fun, weird, and kitschy that celebrates finding beauty not just in elite museum halls but in the aesthetics of the world around us along the post-industrial highways of western PA.

- This show is primarily open to Pittsburgh artists, but all non-local artists can reach out to me to speak in more detail about logistics.
- We are asking a \$20 show fee payable on Venmo @em4761 or cash for the use of the space upon admission to the show (NOT for simply submitting). However, KCC has no intention of turning anyone away for lack of funds--just message me and we can work something out--and artists retain 100% of the proceeds from any sale.
- The artist is responsible for drop-off of the work by Wednesday Feb 1 at the latest, and pickup of the work on Sunday Feb 5.
- 2-dimensional work which can hang on walls is preferred due to space constraints
- Each applicant may submit up to 3 works, but 1 or 2 is also fine.





Originally from New York City, where she completed an internship at the Metropolitan Museum of Art, studied at the Art Students League of Manhattan, and taught in Manhattan public schools, Kim is currently the Executive Director at North Hills Art Center as well as a painting instructor. Kim has won numerous awards, and her work is exhibited in several galleries and businesses. Her murals have been installed in public buildings both locally and in Georgia. As animals cannot "sit" for a portrait in the way humans can, choosing the right reference material is essential in painting animal portraits.


WORKSHOP DESCRIPTION: Participants should bring a variety of references for their animal portraits, making sure there is enough detail in the references chosen, as the workshop will first cover choosing the right reference material. It is helpful to enlarge an image to about 8" x 10". Kim will instruct participants on how to get a likeness and how to obtain accurate fur colors and textures. The workshop will begin with a demonstration and individual instruction will follow. *Participants may bring any water media they choose, but instruction will be done with acrylic paints.* The supplies list provided on the PWS website link is only a suggestion, and participants should bring what they are comfortable using. Virtually any color mixture will make some type of brown!
