Glass Art

Let me start by saying that I have reinvented myself a few times over the years. I really think that everyone needs to do that once in a while – reinvent "you." So I started out as a musician and have two university degrees in music.

While teaching music I took up photography in a rather big way. I have taken many classes, and done a considerable amount of freelance work. I still love photography and do quite a bit – second re-invention!

Along came digital, and Loretta Smith and I enrolled in the Master's program at Duquesne in digital multimedia. So my new reinvention of myself was as a digital/media artist, which is how I got into multi-media publication. Then I sort of retired from teaching (not quite but that is another story) and took up working with glass, which I dearly love and have not been able to do now for a year.

During a conversation with Cindy Gilberti on glass, she managed to convince me that I should try watercolors. Good thing too or I would be a crazy person by now since working at the glass center is sort of out of the question.

I have included a few photographs and some watercolors. The three photos are from the lily pond in the botanic garden. The contrasting

horizontal and vertical reflections, and surrounding growth fascinate me. In addition, did you ever notice how those gorgeous water lilies seem to emerge from a tangled web of snotty looking Yuk? One of the pictures is of an emerging bloom; the other is a beauty in full glory.

On to the watercolors, I have tracked through the seasons from early summer parrot tulips, to summer sunflowers. In between are some lovely dragonflies. Now there is something else beautiful that hangs out in the Yuk on occasion. Hummers visit my deck, so naturally I had to try to paint them. Then along came a bird that I thought was a robin. It was not. Later in the year came winterberries and snowberries.

My latest are the two Buddha's and my fire dancer. I am in love with the blue Buddha. Both of them emerged from a wash and were quite the, "peace bringers."

I am very interested in Peruvian/Inca/Maya culture. They seemed to have this cultural association with blood, fire and gold. I did the wash first but was also playing with painting a dancer. When the wash was dry I knew I had to put the dancer in it. I need to do another one with a much larger dancer but that is for another day!











