Demonstration by Olga Brindar




Demo notes:

- 1. Begin with 3 thumbnail sketches to set the composition
- 2. Lay a background layer of your medium value (mid tone) all over
- 3. Loosely lay out shapes quickly with vine charcoal
- 4. Next you can darken values (but doesn't recommend compressed charcoal or conte yet in this stage because it can become hard to erase)

Next erase your highlights back in - almost sculpting them into 3D



6. Fill in your values, smudging as you go if you want. Use hatching or cross-hatching.



- 7. Move to conte or compressed charcoal when adding in more intense line work & shadows
- **An eraser doesn't mean a mistake, it is just reductive drawing**
- **Olga is using Bristol Vellum paper but you can also buy mid tone paper and add in white conte or compressed charcoal.**
 - 8. She encourages you to walk away for 5 minutes to re-see your drawing with fresh eyes
 - 9. Finish your drawing with fixative or hairspray
