


# R3Q

# What is your favorite oil painting medium?

#### **Lance Maloney:**

"I don't paint in oils now and when I did, my medium was turpentine. It thinned the paints out nicely for me and that also helped speed the drying time."

#### Kelley Bush:

"I always seem to return to using just turpentine or mineral spirits. Liquin was fun as it allowed really easy layering, but on a larger canvas, I felt like I had to use more and more Liquin to get the effect that I wanted. Then I began using 50/50 stand oil and turpentine (or mineral spirits). This combo, too, was intriguing at first, but I began to feel frustrated at the medium's ability to allow me to "work back in" to a specific area. In my current painting, I just decided to bypass the fat/thin mixture I had begun using and opted for a really nice, high grade turpentine. This is actually the first time that I've used a high quality, refined turpentine, and I'm very pleased with the results. The higher quality turpentine seems to provide a little bit of what the other mediums did, but in one package that at the last moment allows me to go back and work in areas."

2. Do you create art that you consider professional (for show) and alternatively, art that you create that's not for public consumption? If yes, why?

#### Lance Maloney:

"I would say No. Most of the time when I create, it's because a subject has caught my attention and I can see it existing in another medium. My philosophy is to create something that I like and hope that a large audience will appreciate it much as I do. To get to that point, I will have to share with the world. Compared to most, the volume of items I complete is so minimal, I'm proud to share each one with those that follow me. I would not want to deprive someone of viewing a piece that may bring joy to their day, week or life (the later should they wind up purchasing it or some form of it). Perhaps if I did more experimenting with different mediums at first, I may hold off on showing them just because I would not feel I've mastered the technique yet. Who knows. Maybe I've mastered it already and just don't know it. I might show it just because I, like most others, share in the need for gratification and support from others with our ventures. I think we all crave the audience's reactions to what we just made, but also fear that same result. Sorry if that got all philosophical and such."

#### Cynthia Gilberti

"Most of my artwork is not for public consumption. The more I paint, I like to think, the better I get. The pile of sketches gets larger everyday. I struggle when I try to paint something for an upcoming exhibit or show. That's when I go back to my pile and find one or two paintings jump out at me and I frame those and enter into a show. Sometimes it works...sometimes it doesn't, but as they say, "...it's all in the journey".

#### **Kelley Bush:**

"As for private and public work, yes! Most definitely yes! I have almost always had two bodies of "expression" that I am working on. One is usually for show, and the other one is where I allow myself more artistic freedom. In school, one of our assignments was to bring in a sample of what we did for artistic fun, or for a hobby. At the time, I was working in sculpture and trying out all kinds of weird materials like using latex or beef bung, wanting to be a bit like Eva Hess or Louise Bourgeois. On the side, though, I was taking photographs and I was playing around with different types of film that the lab would print with different color shifts. Years later, after I moved away from sculpture, but I was still taking photographs. I had dropped the color fluctuations and began to focus solely on land and cloudscapes. Images and scenes that I found sublimely beautiful. I would have the photographs printed on Cibachrome paper. The paper was treated in a way that gave the images an inner light that I was particularly drawing towards. Perhaps I'm less attached or I feel more confident about receiving feedback on the 'public' works. The private body of work, whether it's photography, drawing or sculpture, is where I allow myself to be freer and more spontaneous. I'm now finding how much my love of photography influences my paintings."

#### Lynda Kirby:

"For art meant to show, I am often drawn towards art shows that have a theme. I tend to enjoy the 'assignment' aspect of it, probably because the nature my day job as a graphic designer is to take client input and create a design solution from it, so I am naturally challenged by the boundaries of a prospectus. As far as 'not for public consumption art', I definitely have 2 categories

of art that will probably never get shared with others. (1) Art that turned out really disappointing, and (2) art that I have created some art that served as a bit of an exercise in self-understanding, clarity and focus that I never intended to share (maybe like therapy?)."



This is your year to become a member of the PITTSBURGH Society of Artists, one of the largest artist guilds in western Pennsylvania with more than 300 artist members in all media. We offer artists the chance to join with peers in a lifelong pursuit of artistic expression.

Since 1965, the PITTSBURGH Society of Artists remains dedicated to providing our members with exhibition opportunities and encouraging creative thinking through meetings, workshops, critiques, field trips to museums, artist studios and much more. Become a PITTSBURGH Society of Artists member and take advantage of our valuable resources for personal and artisitic growth such as the fellowship of your peers and interesting programs.

As a member of the PITTSBURGH Society of Artists, all this can be yours. There is no fee for screening. If accepted, annual dues are \$40.00.

Applicants for PITTSBURGHSociety of Artists membership are asked to submit three original works completed within the last two years and not under direct instruction. Each applicant is assigned a number which is attached to each piece for the screening. Work is considered by members of the board of directors. Applicants are accepted by a two-thirds vote of board members present. Work must be finished and gallery-ready. Appropriate hangers and stands must be provided for three-dimensional work.

Following are rough guidelines board members follow in evaluating submissions. These are based on generally accepted guidelines for judging art.

**CONSISTENCY:** The most decisive factor in judging a candidate for membership is the artist's ability to speak with a recognizable voice through their work. Consistency in style and medium allows an artist to showcase their talents in the particular area in which they are most accomplished.

**VISUAL INTEREST:** Visual interest is evaluated by looking at the strength of the work based on the elements and principles of art and design.

**CONTENT**: The work is examined with an eye towards originality, expression and meaning.

**CRAFTSMANSHIP:** Craftsmanship is rated according to the skill and degree of quality in the work and presentation.

All due care will be taken handling art during screening hours. PSA is not responsible for loss or damage of art works.


