- Artboxandpanel.com is where she got her easel set up.
- Maroger and burnt umber to tone the canvas.
 - This type of base is nice because then you can erase later with a paper towel.
- She divides the canvas first and then blocks in shapes with a bigger filbert brush.
- Color recommendations: Flake White works better for still life than Titanium White because it creates a softer blend. Transparent Orange is great for glazing, as it warms everything up.
- Paint recommendation: Gamblin Radiant series colors.
- To begin the grapes and lemons she moves to a smaller filbert.
- Anna got started with still life from painting with an watching videos from Kelli Folsom.
